**Housing:** Approximately 600 homes ranging from 1.5 million to 5 million. Architectural styles include Spanish, Contemporary, and Traditional designs on lots ranging from half-acre to several acres.

**Membership:** Initiation fees approximately 75,000 – 100,000, *monthly dues* 800-1,000. Multiple membership categories available including golf, social, and tennis.
